About **O Christmas Tree** (O Tannenbaum)

O Christmas Tree (or O Tannenbaum in the original German) is one of Europe's favorite Christmas carols, having appeared in Germany in the middle ages about the time the practice of bringing a fir tree into the house and decorating it began in the Rhineland. Germans set up a paradise tree in their homes and decorated it with wafers, cookies, candies and other forms of decoration. The tradition was brought to England in the 19th century by Prince Albert, the German husband of Queen Victoria. The 1st German verse is traditional and the 2nd and 3rd verses (in German) were written in 1824 by Ernst Anschutz, a Leipsig schoolmaster. There are many different translations of the German.

Michael Pratt studied composition with Pulitzer Prize winning composers Ross Lee Finney and Leslie Bassett at The University of Michigan. He has taught music in the public schools for many years in Michigan.

He has sung with The Toledo Choral Society, Toledo Symphony Chorale, Opera!Lenawee, and The University Musical Society Choral Union of The University of Michigan with whom he has performed with The Detroit Symphony Orchestra, The San Francisco Symphony, The Russian National Orchestra, The Ann Arbor Symphony, The Lansing Symphony, The Grand Rapids Symphony, The Toledo Symphony, The Birmingham, Symphony, The Gabrieli Consort, and The Tallis Scholars.
